DIDACTIC REGULATION FOR THE MASTER'S DEGREE COURSE IN PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction and area of competence

1. The present Regulation shall regulate the didactic organization of the Master's Degree Course in Psychology LM-51 and, in particular, shall determine the elements required in the art. 12 of DM 270/04.
2. The present didactic Regulation of the Master's Degree Course in Psychology LM-51, pursuant to the Didactic Regulation of the University, shall be approved by the competent didactic structure by majority and shall be approved by the Technical-Supervisory Committee.

I: PURPOSES AND DIDACTIC RULES

Art. 1 – Introduction

1. The Master's Degree Course in Psychology (hereinafter referred to as DC) belongs to the Degree Class LM-51 as provided for in D.M. 270/2004.
2. The administrative authorities of the DC shall be the Coordinator (hereinafter referred to as CCdL), and the Council of the DC:
 - a. The Coordinator, a teacher appointed by decision of the Technical-Supervisory Committee and shall hold a coordinating function;
 - b. The Council of the DC shall be comprised of teachers who are entitled to at least one course.
3. The didactic rules of the DC in Psychology along with its general framework of formative activities, shall be reported in the attachment forming part of the present Regulation.
4. The present Regulation, pursuant to the academic Didactic Regulation, and to the other didactic regulations, shall regulate the didactic organization of the Degree Course on the elements which were not defined in the aforementioned Regulations.

Art. 2 – Structure of the Degree Course

1. The DC belongs to the Faculty of Psychology.
2. The DC is organized into two years, provides for the acquisition of 120 CFU (CFU) and aims to strengthen the competencies acquired during the Bachelor's Degree Course. In particular, the Master's Degree Course shall provide for the acquisition of theoretical and practical ability to perform psychological interventions (such as prevention, diagnostic consultation, education and consultation) aimed at different users, such as individuals, families, groups or organizations. Upon completion of the studies, after having acquired 120 formative credits, the students shall be conferred the following study title: "Master Doctor in Psychology".
3. The didactic rules of the Master's Degree Course, along with its general reference framework of formative activities, the CFU assigned to each formative activity, drawn up according to a framework defined by ministerial decree and with due regard for the requirements of ANVUR, are contained in **Attachment 1**, which forms an integral part of the present Regulation.
4. The course of study in Psychology includes formative activities groups in the following typologies:
 - a) characterizing activities;
 - b) supplementary activities;
 - c) optional activities;
 - d) activities related to the final dissertation;
 - e) activities related to the internship.
5. The course profiles of each formative activities shall be available on the website of the University, at the following "search for a member of the teaching staff" <https://www.uniecampus.it/en/students/search-for-a-member-of-teaching-staff/>

Art. 3 – Specific formative objectives and description of the educational path

1. As provided for in D.M. 16 March 2007 for the Master's Degrees in Psychology LM-51): in order to access to the Master's Degree is required a solid basic preparation in the following Psychology areas: the psycho-physiological processes underlying behaviour; general psychology; social psychology; developmental psychology; human relations dynamics; methodologies of psychological investigation; statistical methods; psychometrics and data elaboration.

The graduate in Psychology shall acquire:

- Advanced preparation in the theoretical, planning and operational aspects of Psychology;
- The ability to recognize the most relevant characteristics of individuals, groups, organizations and situations as well as to evaluate them with the most appropriate psychological methods (tests, interviews, observation...);
- The ability to plan relational interventions and to manage interactions congruent with the needs of the users (individuals, groups, organizations and communities).
- The ability to evaluate quality, effectiveness and appropriateness of the interventions;
- The ability to assume the responsibility of the interventions, to perform their duties autonomously or in group;
- Competence in the most important IT instruments applied to Psychology;
- Proficiency in a foreign European language.

The graduates in Psychology shall hold high responsibility functions in organization and shall provide services for individuals, groups, and community (school, health, public administration, businesses).

The formative curricula shall provide activities aimed at:

- The acquisition of theoretical and methodological knowledge in all the characterizing areas of Psychology;
- The development of operational and practical competencies;
- The development of knowledge related to professional ethics;.

For the aforementioned purposes the curricula of the DC shall provide for:

- Formative Activities (practical workshops, interactive didactics, practical exercises), for a congruous number of credits;
- Internship activities for a congruous number of credits;
- External activities and students exchange programmes, within the framework of an international agreement (see article 9 of the present Regulation).

The formative objectives of the DC in Psychology are referred to the professional interventions related to clinical and juridical Psychology.

The DC in *Psychology* aims to train a professional figure able to operate autonomously and scientifically. The DC is organized into three curricula:

- a. Clinic and Dynamic Psychology
- b. Juridical Psychology

c. Psychology and New Technologies

2. The ***Clinic and Dynamic Psychology*** curriculum, during the first year provides courses with the following purposes: defining the clinical and dynamic aspects of the psychological-clinical issues for the purpose of the definition of treatment/intervention in a clinical area; Developmental Psychology and Neural Sciences; Health and Social Care. For the second year the curriculum provides courses with the following purposes: providing in-depth knowledge in the aspects related to the analysis of relational dynamics, to the psycho-therapeutic intervention models, and to the Psychological-Social-Pedagogical area. During the second year of the course are provided four mandatory courses (such as Clinical Psychology, Dynamic Psychology, etc.).

The curriculum shall be completed with the Final Dissertation.

The ***Juridical Psychology*** curriculum, during the first year provides courses with the following purposes: understanding the clinical-dynamic aspects related to psychiatric issues; Developmental Psychology and Neural Sciences, thus deepening the relational, cognitive, affective and social aspects of the human life cycle; the curriculum shall also provide courses aimed at the development of legal skills. During the second year, the course shall provide mandatory courses aiming at deepening the student's knowledge in Juridical Psychology and Clinical-Dynamic Psychology. The curriculum shall be completed with the Final Dissertation.

The ***Psychology and New Technologies*** curriculum, during the first year provides courses with the following purposes: providing an analysis of the clinical-dynamic aspects of the psychic distress and of the psychiatric disturbs; the curriculum shall also implement courses aimed at providing knowledge in Psychology and Neural Sciences; Juridical Psychology, as well as technology innovation and information. During the second year, the course shall provide mandatory courses aiming at deepening the students' knowledge in Psycho-Technologies as well as enabling them to plan and implement psychological interventions. The curriculum shall be completed with the Final Dissertation.

3. The present Regulation shall be completed with two attachments annually predisposed by the DC:
 - a) In **Attachment 1** shall be indicated the general framework of the formative activities;
 - b) In **Attachment 2** shall be indicated the formative activities proposed along with the list of the teaching courses and the study plan;
4. All the information required by the current legislation such as the formative objectives of the course of study and the activated formative activities, the list of the teachers involved in

the DC, shall be published on the University website and on the Course Profile.

5. The programmes of the courses and the other formative activities, as well as the calendar of the exams shall be announced before the beginning of the academic year.
6. Le attività formative autonomamente scelte dallo studente, di cui all'Art. 2 comma 4 lettera c, possono essere selezionate tra gli insegnamenti indicati nell'**Allegato 2**.
7. The formative activities, autonomously chosen by the student, provided for in Article 2 paragraph 4, letter c, shall be selected among the teachings indicated in **Attachment 2**, and shall not be submitted for the approval of the council of the Degree Course.
8. There are no planned preparatory activities with regard to the education path.
9. The Study Plan of the Master's Degree Courses in Psychology shall give special priority to the curricular internship, with the aim to have the students experiment their skills in the labour market as an addition to their academic education. The curricular internship shall consist in a period of practical activity (225 hours, equivalent to 9 CFU) aimed exclusively at the attainment of the CFU needed for the successful completion of the formative path of the degree courses and shall not constitute a professionalizing internship for the purpose of the state examinations for the registration to the professional registers (Register of the Psychologists).

Art. 4 – Learning Results

The graduates of the DC shall possess the following abilities:

Knowledge and comprehension

The graduates in Psychology shall acquire the advanced knowledge required in order to take the qualifying examination for the professional practice of Psychologists. Said knowledge shall regard the cognitive, Psycho-Social and developmental processes, as well as Neural-Sciences and the juridical aspects related to health and social management. The acquisition of said abilities shall be evaluated through different forms of verification, such as exams, workshops, internships and the final dissertation.

Applying knowledge and comprehension

The graduates of the Master's Degree Course in Psychology shall acquire the ability to apply the theoretical and practical knowledge provided by the Degree Course to various sectors of Psychology. The acquisition of said abilities shall be evaluated through different forms of verification, such as exams, workshops, internships and the final dissertation.

Making judgements

The graduates of the Master's Degree Course in Psychology shall develop an autonomous opinion on various aspects of the subject matter, based on theoretical knowledge and on

updated research results. Said approach shall be made possible by the confrontation of different theoretical perspectives and by the discussion of a variety of issues related to the subject matters of the basic and charactering activities provided by the learning pathway. Upon completion of their academic career, the graduates shall be able to assume the responsibilities implied by the professions related to Psychology. The acquisition of the ability to make shall be evaluated through different forms of verification, such as exams, workshops, internships and the final dissertation.

Communication Skills

For the graduates in Psychology the acquisition of communication skills is fundamental, since their future professions are characterized by the constant contact with private clients and professionals operating in public and private organizations/companies/businesses/institutions. The ability to summarize and to describe oral and written interactions, as well as to describe the results to psychometric tests, and measuring the effect of interventions, is necessary to the collaboration with other psychologists and professional figures. The graduates shall be able to consult bibliographic sources in at least one foreign European language. The acquisition of said abilities shall be evaluated through different forms of verification, such as exams, workshops, internships and the final dissertation.

Learning Skills

The graduates of the Master's Degree Course in *Psychology* shall develop the ability to constantly update their knowledge and to reflect on the study subject, and on their own learning skills. The acquisition of said abilities has a fundamental role for the insertion of the graduates into the labour market. The acquisition of said abilities shall be evaluated through different forms of verification, such as exams, workshops, internships and the final dissertation.

Art. 5 - Professional figures, sources of employment and education prospects

1. Education prospects for the graduates. The graduates in the Master's Degree Course in *Psychology* may continue their studies to an advanced level (Master, Research Doctorate, Graduate School in Psychotherapy).
2. Sources of employment and education prospects:
 - Developmental Psychology (Istat code 2.5.3.3.2)
 - Local health authorities;
 - Hospitals;

- Schools and Educational Institutions;
 - No-profit associations;
 - Child Support
 - Public and Private centres;
 - Services cooperatives;
 - Communities for minors and adolescents;
 - Rehab Centres and Disabled Rights Centres;
 - Private Practice;
 - Psychological evaluation.
- Labour Psychology (codice Istat 2.5.3.3.3)
 - Consulting Firms;
 - Human Resources Management;
 - Training Organization;
 - No-profit associations;
 - Research Institutes;
 - uffici e funzioni aziendali per il marketing e la comunicazione;
 - web agencies e media agencies;
 - agenzie e servizi per la comunicazione.
- Clinic Psychologists and Psychotherapists (Istat code 2.5.3.3.1)
 - Psychological consultation;
 - Cooperative for Psychological Services;
 - Health authorities;
 - No-profit associations;
 - Family Consultants;

The graduates may carry out the profession of Psychologists and Psychotherapists in compliance with the current legislation and subject to a specific post-graduate education.

Art. 6 – Admission and enrolment

1. In order to enrol into the DC the students shall satisfy the following requirements:
Bachelor's Degree in Sciences and Techniques of Psychology provided for in law 270/04 and law 509/99, an equivalent Degree attained abroad, deemed appropriate according to the current legislation.
2. Shall be admitted to the Degree Course all the students with a Bachelor's Degree that does

not belong to the Degree Classes provided for in the previous paragraph, provided that the candidate has attained the following CFU/SSD:

- At least 36 CF in M-PSI/01 and/or M-PSI/02 and/or M-PSI/03;
- At least 12 CFU in M-PSI/04;
- At least 18 CFU in M-PSI/05 and/or M-PSI/06;
- At least 18 CFU in M-PSI/07 and/or M-PSI/08.

3. The students who did not attain the aforementioned credits shall not be admitted to the Master's Degree Course in Psychology.
4. There shall not be any limits to the possibility of enrolment as 'studente fuori corso', nor a maximum number of repeatable years.
5. Without prejudice to the curricular requirements, for the purpose of the admission to the Master's Degree Course the students shall take an oral exam for the assessment of their personal preparation. In that respect the DC shall identify a dedicated evaluation committee.
6. The recognition of the CFU of the incoming students as well as the quantification of the minimum number of CFU that the students shall attain in an academic year in order to continue the course of study to another academic year, shall be established in the related Academic Regulations.

Art. 7 - Examinations and tests

1. For each formative activity shall be provided an examination, upon completion of the didactic activities represented by the learning objects present in the VLE. The students shall acquire the CFU attributed to a particular formative activity only if they pass the relative examination. The examination and the final evaluations needed for the attainment of the title shall not be more than 10. For the purpose of the calculation shall be considered the following formative activities:
 - a) characterizing;
 - b) supplementary;
 - c) optional;
 - d) related to the final dissertation;
 - e) related to the internship.
2. The examinations shall consist in a test structured in conformity with what is provided for in the "Regulation for the implementation of the examination" and with due regard for the

following rules:

- a) The examination shall be organized so as to evaluate the knowledge, the comprehension, and the application of the examination subjects, demonstrating the proficiency of the student in the didactic units/thematic units of the related course.
3. The final evaluation shall take into account the results of the partial examinations, carried out with due regard for the Academic Regulations, in which case the teacher shall specify in the “course profile” the kind of activity, the modalities and the criteria of evaluation.
4. The professor in charge of the teaching, before the beginning of each academic year, and with due regard for the general regulation of the University, shall communicate the modalities for the examination, the assessment criteria and the possibility to carry out partial examinations. The manner in which the examination shall be carried out shall be the same for all the students with due regard for what has been established at the beginning of the academic year.
5. Eventual partial verifications shall not replace the final examination.
6. With regard to the implementation of the examinations shall be applicable the rules provided for by the Academic Regulation.

Art 8 — Duration

1. Shall be applicable the rules provided for by the Academic Regulation.

Art 9 - Mobility and studying abroad

1. The Degree Course, in line with the provisions of the University shall promote the exchange of teachers and students through international cooperation and bilateral agreements. In this regard see the indications published on the website of the University on the International
2. Cooperation and the Erasmus Policy at the following link:

Art. 10 - Examinations and tests

1. The final dissertation shall be written by the student with the supervision of a teacher of the Faculty of Psychology or of an external teacher entitled to one of the teachings provided for the Master’s Degree Course in Psychology. The elaboration of the final dissertation, shall begin at least six months before the date estimated for the discussion, in order to guarantee its accuracy. The discussion of the final dissertation shall consist in the

presentation of a written dissertation realized by the student under the guidance of a supervisor with due regard for and with the procedures provided for in the related Academic Regulations and in the guidelines of the Faculty of Psychology (see the portal of the University).

2. The final dissertation shall focus on any subject related to one or more formative activities of the following typology:
 - a) Characterizing;
 - b) Supplementary;
 - c) Optional
3. The students may realize a:
 - a) Theoretical Dissertation, based on the discussion of the bibliography of a chosen subject matter;
 - b) Empirical Dissertation, based on an autonomous research activity.
4. The final dissertation may be written in a foreign language previously agreed upon with the supervising professor and the Coordinator of the Degree Course. In such case the student shall provide a detailed summary of the dissertation in Italian.
5. The final dissertation shall be discussed publically, shall be evaluated: 1) completeness and rigour of the dissertation; 2) methodology; 3) results of the dissertation. The dissertation shall be assigned maximum 8 points.

Art. 11 — Attainment of the Degree

1. The student shall attain the Master's Degree with at least 120 CFU and upon completion and discussion of the final examination (final dissertation).
2. With regard to the conditions for the admission to the final dissertation, the degree examination board, the implementation of the examination and the final grade see the Academic Regulation for the final dissertation.

I - OPERATIVE RULES

Art. 12 — Obligations related to frequency

1. The student shall be admitted to the examination related to a determined teaching only after having implemented all the online learning objects making up the course, except for expressed and motivated waivers provided for by the teachers, who shall clarify them in their teacher's profile.
2. The DC provides for the enrolment as part-time student, for all the qualified students, pursuant to what is regulated in the Academic Regulations.

Art. 13 — Enrolment to the following years, transfer and withdrawal from the studies

1. See the Academic Regulations.

Art. 14 — Recognition of incoming CFU

1. See the general regulations provided for by the University; along with the opinion of the DC if the aforementioned regulation shall require so.

Art. 15 - Dispositions for the students

1. The DC shall apply the rules provided for by the University regulating the frequency to the formative activities, the number of the credits to be acquired for the enrolment to the following course year; the requirements for the implementation of outsourcing education, and all the actions aimed at an effective learning. In this regard see the Student Regulation, the website page on the LDs and the Erasmus Policy of the University.

Art. 16 - Assessment of the Didactic Activity

1. The DC shall implement forms of assessment of the quality of the didactic activities provided for by the current legislation with the modalities and the deadlines provided for by the University's Quality Assurance Committee.

Art. 17 - Flexibility of the learning pathway

1. The Master's Degree Course in Psychology, with the collaboration of the online tutors (OT) proposes orientation and tutoring activities in relation to the individual study plan, of the optional formative activities and with regard to the implementation of the curricular internship, promoting a student-centred approach to learning focused on encouraging the assumption of an active role in the definition and in the time frame of the learning pathway. The DC shall promote a collaboration with the disciplinary tutors whom, coordinating with the teachers in charge of the course, shall have the task of supporting the preparation of the didactic materials and of the partial examinations, guaranteeing the possibility to implement flexible learning pathways. Finally, the student shall have the possibility to enrol in the DC and to take advantage of the formative offer at any time of the academic year and to carry out the examinations during the seven examination sessions, provided for in the academic calendar.

II - FINAL AND TRANSITIONAL RULES

Art. 18 - Amendments to the Regulation

1. Any amendment to the present Regulation shall be proposed by the Coordinator of the DC or by at least one third of the members of the Council of the DC or at least one third of the members of the Council of the DC and shall be approved by absolute majority and, successively, by the Technical Supervisory Committee.
2. In case of failure to approve the amendment, the proponent shall send a response, along with a report describing its motivations directly to the Technical Supervisory Committee.
3. The modifications to the present regulation, subject to the verification of their conformity to the Academic Regulations shall be issued by Decree of the President of the Technical Supervisory Committee.
4. Eventual legislative acts compatible with the Academic Regulation and incompatible with what is stated in the present regulation shall be applicable even in the absence of an expressed modification, but shall determine the immediate beginning of the procedure provided for in the first paragraph of the present article.

5. Eventual interpretive or applicative problems resulting from the succession of the Regulations in the course of time shall be the subject of a specific assessment on the part of the DC.

Art. 19 - Transitional regulations
