



DIDACTIC REGULATION

Master's Degree in Law

Degree Class LMG/01

Faculty of Law

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Title I - PURPOSES AND DIDACTIC RULES

Art. 1 – Introduction

1. The present Regulation shall regulate the didactic organization of the Master's Degree Course in Law LMG/01 and, in particular, shall determine the elements required in the art. 12 of DM 270/04.
2. The present didactic Regulation of the Master's Degree Course in Law LMG/01, pursuant to the Didactic Regulation of the University, shall be approved by the competent didactic structure by majority and shall be approved by the Technical-Supervisory Committee.

Art. 2 Didactic Rules

1. The administrative authorities of the DC shall be the Coordinator (hereinafter referred to as CCdL), the Council of the DC:
 - a) The Coordinator, a teacher appointed by decision of the Technical-Supervisory Committee and shall hold a coordinating function;
 - b) The Council of the DC shall be comprised of teachers who are entitled to at least one teaching;
2. The didactic rules of the Master' Degree in Law along with its general framework of formative activities, shall be reported in the attachment forming part of the present Regulation.
3. The present Regulation, pursuant to the academic Didactic Regulation, and to the other didactic regulations, shall regulate the didactic organization of the Degree Course on the elements which were not defined in the aforementioned Regulations.

Art. 3 - Structure of the Degree Course

1. The DC belongs to the Faculty of Law
2. The DC is organized into five years, provides for the acquisition of 300 CFU and aims to train high-level legal experts fit for duties such as: magistrate, lawyer, notary or juridical expert. Upon completion of the studies, after having acquired 240 formative credits, the students shall be conferred the following study title: "Master Doctor in Law".
3. The didactic rules of the Master's Degree Course, along with its general reference framework of formative activities, the CFU assigned to each formative activity, drawn up according to a framework defined by ministerial decree and with due regard for the requirements of ANVUR, are contained in **Attachment 1**, which forms an integral part of the present Regulation.
4. The course of study in Industrial Engineering includes formative activities groups in the following typologies:
 - a) Basic formative activities;
 - b) Characterizing activities;

- c) Supplementary Activities;
- d) Optional Activities;
- e) Activities related to the final dissertation;
- f) activities related to the internship

5. The course profiles of each formative activities shall be available on the website of the University, at the following “search for a member of the teaching staff” <https://www.uniecampus.it/en/students/search-for-a-member-of-teaching-staff/>

Art. 4 - Specific formative objectives and description of the educational path

1. The Master’s Degree Course in Law is organized into one curriculum.
2. The present Regulation shall be completed with three attachments annually predisposed by the DC:
 - a) In **Attachment 1** shall be indicated the general framework of the formative activities;
 - b) In **Attachment 2** shall be indicated the formative activities proposed along with the list of the teaching courses and the study plan;
3. All the information required by the current legislation such as the formative objectives of the course of study and the activated formative activities, the list of the teachers involved in the DC, shall be published on the University website and on the Course Profile.
4. The programmes of the courses and the other formative activities, as well as the calendar of the exams shall be announced before the beginning of the academic year.
5. The formative activities, autonomously chosen by the student, provided for in Article 2 paragraph 4, letter c, shall be selected among the teachings indicated in **Attachment 2**, and shall not be submitted for the approval of the council of the Degree Course.
6. The Degree Course, in fact, shall offer an ongoing orientation and tutoring service which avails itself of the assistance of tutors selected by the University and operating in conjunction with the coordinator and the Council of the Course of Study.
7. There are no planned preparatory activities with regard to the education path.
8. The Plan of Study provides for the implementation of an internship period, aimed at the comprehension of the link between theory, professional practice and the learning of practical-methodological procedures attributable to the cultural-scientific area of interest of the Degree Course.

Art. 4 - Learning Results

1. The graduates of the Degree Course shall possess the following knowledge and abilities.

a. Knowledge and Comprehension

The Master's Degree Course in Law shall provide competencies needed in order to operate effectively in various profiles typical of the legal professions. The course offers knowledge and comprehension of the most important phenomena of contemporary legislative policy and Italian/European juridical culture through an in-depth analysis of the various branches of Jurisprudence. The course shall also provide in-depth knowledge of History and Philosophy, so as to enable the students to understand the historical and philosophical evolution of Jurisprudence. The graduates in Law shall also acquire knowledge in Constitutional Law, Private Law, Administrative Law, Commercial Law, Comparative Law, European Union Law, Public Law, International Law, Labour Law, Criminal Law, English and IT.

b. Ability to apply knowledge and comprehension

The graduate in Law shall possess the ability to apply the theoretical knowledge acquired, related to the sectors provided for in the previous paragraphs.

The graduates shall also be able to produce legal texts (legislative texts, negotiating texts, procedural texts). Upon completion of the studies, the graduates shall acquire full operational independence, and shall be able to:

- a) Face and solve the most recurring juridical problems applying the notions acquired within their working environment;
- b) Understand, prepare and apply contracts and documents;
- c) Manage the profiles related to organizational juridical aspects of the administrative procedures;
- d) Consult autonomously the juridical databases.

c. Making judgements

The students shall also acquire the ability to face interpretative and application problems related to Jurisprudence such as reporting, understanding, representing and assessing legal cases.

d. Communication Skills

The graduates in Law shall acquire a correct legal language in order to be able to elaborate clear and well-argued documents, also using IT instruments.

9. The great formative offer aims to provide abilities and knowledge for the access to the professions for which the students are training. The graduates shall be offered the possibility to study English and IT, as well as Roman Law, Criminology, Privacy, Sports Law and Human Rights.

10. The students shall attain the aforementioned knowledge and comprehension abilities through the implementation of didactic activities provide for in the learning pathway.

11. The professors shall assess the acquisition of said knowledge and comprehension through partial examinations, as well as written/oral examinations.
12. The didactic activities shall be mainly implemented through online lessons and online seminars (webinar); and tutoring.

Art. 5 - Professional figures, sources of employment and education prospects

1. The main professional figures related the Degree Course are the following: Lawyer, Magistrate, Notary, Legal Consultant, National/Local Public Administrations Manager. Specialists in Political Science, Experts in Political/Historical dynamics.
2. The main sources of employment related the Degree Course are the following: Lawyer, Magistrate Notary, Legal Consultant, Diplomat, functions of high responsibility in private businesses, public administrations, Universities and schools.

Art. 6 – Admission and Enrolment

1. The students who intend to enrol in the DC shall be in possession of a secondary school certificate or another qualification attained abroad and recognized as suitable pursuant to the current legislation;
2. Subject to the admission requirements in the examinations shall be evaluated the following knowledge and competencies: basic knowledge and competencies in the following sectors:
 - a) Basic notions of the most important principles of Public Law and Private Law;
 - b) Basic knowledge of the most important principles of History/Law/Philosophy.
3. The knowledge and competencies provided for in the previous paragraph shall be verified through a non-selective test provided for in the online platform of the University.
4. Eventual negative results of the non-selective tests:
 - a) Shall not preclude the matriculation and attendance to the lectures (without prejudice to what is provided for in paragraph 8 of the present article);
 - b) Shall implicate the attribution of additional training requirements (OFA), aimed at the fulfilment of the identified lack.
5. If the incoming students have already acquired the CFU related to IUS/01 and IUS/08, they already possess the knowledge and competencies provided for in letter a) of the previous paragraph; if the incoming students have already acquired the CFU related to IUS/18, IUS/19 and IUS/20, they already possess the knowledge and competencies provided for in letter b).
6. The OFA shall consist in the telematic frequency in the University's Virtual Learning Environment.
7. The OFA shall be fulfilled within the first year of the degree course, provide for a proficiency test for each remedial course.
8. The students who did not fulfil their OFA attaining all the qualifications provided for in the

previous point shall not enrol into the following course year, and shall repeat the course year; if enrolled to the final year they shall not be entitled to submit the graduation application.

9. The fulfilment of the OFA shall not implicate the assignment of any credit.

10. There shall not be any limits to the possibility of enrolment as 'studente fuori corso', nor a maximum number of repeatable years.

11. The recognition of the CFU of the incoming students as well as the quantification of the minimum number of CFU that the students shall attain in an academic year in order to continue the course of study to another academic year, shall be established in the related Academic Regulations.

Art. 7 - Examinations and tests

12. For each formative activity shall be provided an examination, upon completion of the didactic activities represented by the learning objects present in the VLE.

13. The students shall acquire the CFU attributed to a particular formative activity only if they pass the relative examination.

14. The examination and the final evaluations needed for the attainment of the title shall not be more than 29. For the purpose of the calculation shall be considered the following formative activities:

- a) Basic;
- b) Characterizing;
- c) Supplementary;
- d) Optional;
- e) Related to the Final Dissertation;
- f) Further linguistic knowledge, eventual formative internships, IT, telematic and relational abilities.

15. The examinations shall consist in a test structured in conformity with what is provided for in the "Regulation for the implementation of the examination and with due regard for the following rules:

- a) The examination shall be organized so as to evaluate the knowledge, the comprehension, and the application of the examination subjects, demonstrating the proficiency of the student in the didactic units/thematic units of the related course.
- b) The final evaluation shall take into account the results of the partial examinations, carried out with due regard for the Academic Regulations, in which case the teacher shall specify in the "course profile" the kind of activity, the modalities and the criteria of evaluation.

16. The professor in charge of the teaching, before the beginning of each academic year, and with due regard for the general regulation of the University, shall communicate the modalities for the examination, the assessment criteria and the possibility to carry out partial examinations. The manner in which the examination shall be carried out shall be the same for all the students with due regard for what has been established at the beginning of the academic year.

17. Eventual partial verifications shall not replace the final examination.
18. The professor in charge of the course, before the beginning of each academic year, and with due regard for the general regulation of the University, shall schedule the exams subject to the following criteria:
 - a) The written examinations shall not begin before 9.30 a.m.
 - b) The written/oral examinations shall not begin after 5.00 p.m.
 - c) The written/oral examinations scheduled on a Saturday shall not begin after 12.00 a.m.
 - d) The professors shall not schedule any exam in other branches of the University during the days when an exam session is already scheduled in the Novedrate campus.
19. With regard to the implementation of the examinations shall be applicable the rules provided for by the Academic Regulation.

Art. 8 Mobility and studying abroad

1. The Degree Course, in line with the provisions of the University shall promote the exchange of teachers and students through international cooperation and bilateral agreements. In this regard, please see the indications published on the website of the University on the International Cooperation and the Erasmus Policy at the following link:

Art. 9 - Final Dissertation

1. The Final Dissertation consists in a written composition independently elaborated by the student under the guidance of a supervising professor, subject to the modalities provided for in the Academic Regulation and in the Faculty Regulation.
2. The elaboration of the final dissertation, shall begin at least six months before the date estimated for the discussion, in order to guarantee its accuracy; and shall be submitted to the supervising professor at least two months before its discussion.
3. The final dissertation shall focus on any subject related to one or more formative activities of the following typology:
 - a. Basic;
 - b. Characterizing;
 - c. Supplementary;
 - d. Optional.
4. The final dissertation may be written in a foreign language previously agreed upon with the supervising professor and the Coordinator of the Degree Course. In such case the student shall provide a detailed summary of the dissertation in Italian.
5. The dissertation shall refer to the following typologies:
 - a) critical analysis of a particular research article or of a theoretical contribution;
 - b) an in-depth theoretical and/or empirical analysis of a subject related to a particular course or to another didactic activity;

6. The final dissertation shall be discussed publically, shall be evaluated: 1) completeness and rigour of the dissertation; 2) methodology; 3) results of the dissertation. The dissertation shall be assigned maximum 8 points

Art. 9 - Attainment of the Degree

1. The student shall be attain the Degree with at least 300 CFU and upon completion and discussion of the final examination (final dissertation).

2. With regard to the conditions for the admission to the final dissertation, the degree examination board, the implementation of the examination and the final grade see the Academic Regulation for the final dissertation.

3. The secretariat upon request, shall provide the graduate students with the Diploma Supplement, which shall describe the category, the level, the context, the content and the status of the studies carried out in accordance with the standard eight-point plan developed on the initiative of the European Commission, the European Council and of the UNESCO.

Title II - OPERATIVE RULES

Art. 10 - Obligations related to frequency

1. Frequency to the formative activities is not mandatory.

2. The student shall be admitted to the examination related to a determined teaching only after having implemented all the online learning objects making up the course, except for expressed and motivated waivers provided for by the teachers, who shall clarify them in their teacher's profile.

The DC provides for the enrolment as part-time student, for all the qualified students, pursuant to what is regulated in the Academic Regulations.

Art. 11 - Enrolment to the following years, transfer and withdrawal from the studies

1. See the rules provided for in the Academic Regulations.

Art. 12 - Recognition of incoming CFU

1. See the general regulations provided for by the University; along with the opinion of the DC if the aforementioned regulation shall require so.

Art. 13 - Assessment of the Didactic Activity

1. The DC shall apply the rules provided for by the University regulating the frequency to the formative activities, the number of the credits to be acquired for the enrolment to the following course year; the requirements for the implementation of outsourcing education, and all the actions aimed at an effective learning. In this regard see the Student Regulation, the website page on the LDs and the Erasmus Policy of the University.

Art. 14 - Dispositions for the students

1. The DC shall apply the rules provided for by the University regulating the frequency to the formative activities, the number of the credits to be acquired for the enrolment to the following course year; the requirements for the implementation of outsourcing education, and all the actions aimed at an effective learning. In this regard see the Student Regulation, the website page on the LDs and the Erasmus Policy of the University.

Art. 15 - Flexibility of the learning pathway

1. The Degree Course in Law, with the collaboration of the online tutors (OT) proposes orientation and tutoring activities in relation to the individual study plan, of the optional formative activities and with regard to the implementation of the curricular internship, promoting a student-centred approach to learning focused on encouraging the assumption of an active role in the definition and in the time frame of the learning pathway. The DC shall promote a collaboration with the disciplinary tutors whom, coordinating with the teachers in charge of the course, shall have the task of supporting the preparation of the didactic materials and of the partial examinations, guaranteeing the possibility to implement flexible learning pathways. Finally, the student shall have the possibility to enrol in the DC and to take advantage of the formative offer at any time of the academic year and to carry out the examinations during the seven examination sessions, provided for in the academic calendar.

Art. 16 - Convocation Modalities and Implementation of the CCDL

1. The CCDL shall be summoned by a Coordinator, or by a member of the Technical-Supervisory Committee, at the Novedrate Campus, at least once a year.

2. The CCDL shall be summed whenever one third of its members shall require so, or upon initiative of the Rector, Director General or upon decision of the Technical-Supervisory Committee.

3. The CCDL shall be summoned by communication at the academic email of the professor (@uniecampus.it) at least fifteen days before the meeting.

4. It is possible to organize meetings through telecommunication conference, provided that the principles of good faith and equality of treatment are respected.

5. The meetings of the CCDL shall be implemented through written consultation in asynchronous modality; in such case shall be decided a congruous deadline (minimum three days, maximum seven days) within which a member of the CCDL is required to replicate. The lack of a response shall equal to a non-attendance to the meeting.

Title III - FINAL AND TRANSITIONAL REGULATIONS

Art. 17 - Amendments to the Regulation

1. Any amendment to the present Regulation shall be proposed by the Coordinator of the DC or by

at least one third of the members of the Council of the DC or at least one third of the members of the Council of the DC and shall be approved by absolute majority and, successively, by the Technical Supervisory Committee.

2. In case of failure to approve the amendment, the proponent shall send a response, along with a report describing its motivations directly to the Technical Supervisory Committee.

3. Any modification to the present regulation, subject to the verification of their conformity to the Academic Regulations shall be issued by Decree of the President of the Technical Supervisory Committee.

4. Eventual legislative acts compatible with the Academic Regulation and incompatible with what is stated in the present regulation shall be applicable even in the absence of an expressed modification, but shall determine the immediate beginning of the procedure provided for in the first paragraph of the present article.

5. Eventual interpretive or applicative problems resulting from the succession of the Regulations in the course of time shall be the subject of a specific assessment on the part of the DC.

Art. 15 - Transitional regulations

1. The present regulation shall be applicable from the academic year 2018/2019.
