REGULATIONS ON THE DISCUSSION OF THE FINAL DISSERTATION

1 REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ADMISSION

Shall be admitted to the Final Dissertation all the students whom have passed all the examinations provided for in their Study Plan within the limits provided for in the Regulation on Academic Masters.

The students shall submit the title of their Final Dissertation/Work job, at least three months before the date of the discussion.

The application form for the discussion of the final dissertation shall be submitted to the student secretariat maximum 15 days before the date of the discussion. The application shall not be considered valid if the aforementioned conditions are not satisfied.

2 EXAMINATION BOARD

The Examination Board for the discussion of the Final Dissertation of an Academic Master may be comprised of full professors, associate professors and researcher of the Faculty. The Board may also be comprised of adjunct professors and online tutors.

In exceptional cases the Examination Board may be comprised of professors from other Faculties. The examination board for the final examination, may be comprised of 7 members (minimum 5 members) shall be chaired by the President of the Academic Masters or by the President of the Faculty, whom may indentify a delegate, selected among the full professors of the Faculty and, in exceptional cases, among the adjunct professors of the Faculty.

3 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DISCUSSION

The final examination shall consist in the oral discussion of the Final Dissertation.

The final dissertation shall be accurate, rigorous and easily readable. Once the student has concluded the Final Dissertation, the composition shall be submitted to the Didactic Secretariat at least 15 days prior to the date of the discussion.

4 FINAL GRADE

The final grade shall be expressed in hundred-tenths, and shall be assigned according both to the student's academic curriculum and the final dissertation.

The evaluation of the academic curriculum shall be calculated on the basis of the weighted average of the grades attained by the student in proportion to the CFU attributed to each passed examination.

The evaluation of the final dissertation, decided by the board, shall be based on the proposal of the supervisor; and shall confer a maximum of 12 points.

The supervisor shall submit to the examination board an evaluation sheet drafted according to the attached reference framework and which shall forma n integral part of the student's academic record.

The final grade shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number.



The particularly worthy students, whose grade exceeds 110/110 may be assigned the honours upon unanimous judgement of the examination board.
